THE LEGEND OF GODDESS SRI KANYAKA PARAMESWARI

Penugonda was a flourishing city of 18 towns. It was ruled by Kusuma Chetty. Although blessed with wealth, position, health, knowledge and name he had no children. As mentioned in the scriptures, he decided to perform all kinds of rituals. His family priest Bhaskaracharya advised him to perform putrakameshtiyaga to beget a child. The activity lasting for seven days ended with the emergence of mother Parvathi from the fire pit. She blessed him with a kalpaka fruit to fulfill his longing for children. The children would be virtuous, famous and blessed with an inexhaustible spiritual treasure to guide mankind eternally.

As ordained, beautiful twins named Virupaksha and Vasavi were born to Kusuma Chetty's wife Kausumbi. Vasavi was the personification of beauty and intelligence. She was born to teach, propagate and establish the power of chastity and excellence of womanhood. She was born to end carnality, ignominious lust and inaugurate a new epoch of magnificent womanhood and chastity.

Vishnu Vardhan of Chatukya Dynasty was an emperor of indomitable valour and unquenchable thirst for power. Though he possessed enviable virtues, there were flaws. Abominable among them was his despicable lust. He had a roving eye for blooming beauties. After conquering many kingdoms in the north, he came down south to Penugonda. After a brief stay in Penugonda, Kusuma Chetty gave a farewell party to the king. It was then the king's eyes fell on Vasavamba. His look pierced with sensuality divested her of her maidenly honour and virginal purity. The king demanded the hand of Vasavamba. The elders and Kusuma Chetty were annoyed. Many supported the king's wish due to fear.

Out of 714 gothrikas, 102 were against the marriage and decided to jump into the fire pit along with Vasavamba. The 612 gothrikas were for the marriage but as it did not materialise they left the town fearing the attack of Vishnu vardhan. When her parents were in turmoil, Vasavi showed her original goddess form to her parents. She stood in the beneficent form of Mother Parasakthi with four hands, holding lotus, veena, parrot and pasa. She added " ... if any impious lustful eye falls upon woman's pure virtuous body it loses all its power and strength ... kamadarshini defiles woman's divine chastity, and leaves a scar in the spotless body". She decided to cleanse her stained impure body by jumping into the sacred fire pit. Along with her, elderly couples of 102 gothrikas also jumped into the fire pits chanting "Hail Vasavamba, long live Jaganmata".

In the meantime Vishnu Vardhan marched into the city with an army to abduct Vasavamba by force and punish all. When he entered the place he saw Mother's shining resplendent for emerging from the fire pit. On seeing her form, his sinful head broke into innumerable pieces and from that rose an effulgent flame, which finally fell at the lotus feet of the Goddess.

Goodess Vasavamba became chastity incarnate by self immolation. She demonstrated to the whole world the potentialities of Srisakti. She proved to the whole world that chastity is the prime virtue of a woman. If she had wanted she could have lived the life of a queen. Instead she valued high morals which raised her as the mighty goddess of not only the Vysyas but all Hindus. Her purity, chastity, courage, strength, steadfastness and care for community are to be well understood and cherished.

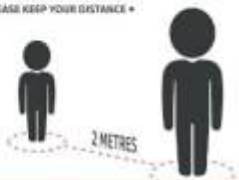

RULES & REGULATIONS

Rules for students:

DOS

- Student should be present in the college at 8.50 a.m. for shift - I and 9.50 a.m. for shift- II before the bell for the college prayer.
- Student should wear Identity card before entering the college.
- Only vegetarian food is allowed inside the campus.
- Student should be neatly dressed and wear long top.
- Student should be present and wear plain white salwar and kurta during national festivals celebrated by the college.
- Student should place their mobile phone or any electronic gadgets in the lockers provided inside college premises.
- College is not responsible for any personal belongings of the students.
- English is the mandatory language inside the college campus.
- It is the fundamental duty of the student to keep the college campus clean, pollution free & plastic free.
- Student should seek permission while entering the class, staff room and office.
- Student should seek prior permission in case of absence or leave.
- A letter from the parent should be submitted to the Class in charge within two days of absence or leave.
- Student should seek prior permission before joining associations not connected with college.
- Student should be courteous and respectful to the staff.
- Student should attend Soft Skills, Practical Classes, Internal Assessment, EDP and Exams College & University.
- Student should pay the tuition fees within first ten working days of college without fine and within 20 days with fine of Rs.10/- per day.
- Standing order of the college which is displayed in the notice board.
- Student should stay back till the end of the college functions.
- Student should uphold the good name of the college.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Rules for students:

DON'TS

- Use of mobile phones inside the college campus is strictly prohibited.
- Student Should not bring any discredit to the college.
- Student should not indulge in damaging the college properties, misuse of articles and should desist from dirtying and defacing the college campus.
- Student should not can leave the classroom without the permission of the faculty.
- Late attendance shall be considered as violation of order and discipline.
- Late attendance during a particular period without a valid reason will result in the cancellation of attendance.
- Organizing mass absence should be avoided.
- Ragging, taking drugs, playing cards, entertaining outsiders and. indulging anti social activities are serious offences and punishable.
- Holding of agitation, demonstrations and instigating violence inside or outside campus are considered as a breach of discipline.
- Loitering, shouting, whistling and causing nuisance in the college premises are strictly prohibited.
- Student will not be permitted to go out of the college for any reason during the college hours. In case of emergency parents must accompany with student while leaving the college.
- Student should not go to canteen during the class hours.
- A student should not prevent fellow students from attending classes or any college duties.

Important Note:

Violation of the College rules is punishable Subjected to anyone or more of the following actions subject to the approval of the Management.

1. Cancellation of attendance.
2. Suspension from the college for a specific period.
3. Detention.
4. Expulsion from the college depending on the degree and seriousness of the offence.
5. Withholding or making remarks in the Transfer Certificate.

RULES & REGULATIONS

Rules for Parents

- Student should be present at the college before 8.50 a.m. for shift-1 and 09.50 am for shift - II for the college prayer.
- A fine amount of Rs. 20/- will be collected for late coming in order to inculcate discipline.
- Parents should be aware of all disciplinary actions.
- Student should not use mobile phone or electronic devices in the college campus.
- Laptop is permitted with prior permission from the department.
- A fine of Rs.500/- will be collected from your ward if she uses mobile phone or electronic devices inside the campus.
- A locker is provided for keeping mobile phones in case of necessity.
- Tuition Fees should be paid within first ten working days after the reopening of college without fine and within 20 working days with fine of Rs. 10/- per day.
- Student name will be removed from roll for non-payment of fees and should pay Rs.500/- as readmission fee.
- In the event of discontinuing / withdrawal from the programme a requisition application duly signed by the parents / guardian should be given to the office.
- In case of withdrawal all dues should be paid such as course fee and all other fees with regard to college activities and library books be returned.
- Exam fees, Soft skills fees, EDP, Practical fees and other fees related to various programmes i.e. workshops, seminars etc. should be borne by the students.
- Student should attend the Internal Assessment exams without fail, in case of absence fine amount will be collected.
- Each semester Parents Teacher Meet is mandatory.
- Ward must have a minimum of 75% attendance for University Examination, if not condonation amount should be paid to the University for having 65% -74% attendance. Others having attendance 50% -64% are not eligible to write the University exam and less than 50% attendance have to redo the semester.
- In the event of any in-disciplinary activity or violation of rules, the Principal in consultation with College Council may take any disciplinary action.
- Standing Order of the college is displayed in the college notice board.
- Students should stay back till the end of the college functions.

COLLEGE COUNCIL

The College Council shall be the competent authority to amend any or all the provisions of the constitution if warranted by circumstances and also shall have the power to frame rules or by- laws subject to the provision of the rules and regulations of the College.

The opinion of the College Council on matter of discipline is final. On all other aspects it is a recommendatory body.

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

CLASS TOPPER

- In both the semesters there should be no arrears (Major as well as Allied, Language, English, Basic Tamil / Advance Tamil, Skill Enhancement Course, Foundation Course, Value Education & EVS).
- Only university marks will be considered.

COLLEGE PROFICIENCY

- Applicable only for final year students
- Separately given for Major, Language & English
- All the three years in the case of UG Programmes and all the second years in the case of PG Programmes Internal Assessment marks will be considered.

UNIVERSITY PROFICIENCY

- Applicable only for passed out students
- Separately given for Major, Language & English
- All the three years University Exam marks will be considered.

BEST OUT GOING

- Applicable only for final year students
- Excellence in Academics (All exams, Paper Presentation)
- Participation in Co & Extra - curricular activities & Sports
- Service rendered to the college & the society

ALL ROUNDER

- Applicable only for final year students
- Versatile in Academics, Co-curricular activities, Extra curricular activities & Sports
- Service rendered to the college and the society

University Rules and Regulations

Attendance: As per University of Madras, 75% of attendance of the total working days are compulsory to attend the university exam, failing which the student has to abide by the following procedures.

Procedures:-

Percentage of attendance	Condition of Student	Procedure to be followed
65% to 74%	Eligible to write the exam on payment of condonation fee. *	An amount of Rs.250 each for theory and practical shall be paid as condonation. A medical certificate must be provided if any.
50% to 64%	Not eligible to attend the university exam, can proceed to the next year/next semester. Permitted to take university exam along with current semester as arrears.	An amount of Rs.250/- each for theory and practical shall be paid as condonation. The candidate can appear in the forthcoming semester and it will be considered as arrears
Less than 50%	Semester to be repeated / rejoining** by the candidate	Communication from university must be obtained by the candidate to rejoin / redo the semester enquire the department concerned regarding the availability of vacancy.

* Married women students, if they conceive during their academic career the minimum attendance for condonation shall be 55%. The candidate must submit the Medical Certificate.

- Internal Assessment will be conducted by the Department.
- **Internal marks:** A Student should possess internal marks by ensuring equal performance in Internal Assessment, Assignment, Seminar & Attendance, thus obtaining minimum 10 marks for UG and 13 marks for PG.
- Assignments, records and seminar are part of the internals. It should be submitted on time.

LIBRARY RULES

1. Library will be open on all working days between 8.30 a.m. and 6.00 p.m.
2. Library is automized and digitized with DELNET facility.
3. All students are entitled to borrow books from the college library.
4. A student is entitled to keep a book for 14 days from the date of issue.
5. A book borrowed should be returned on the due date marked on the due slip.
6. Once borrowed the book will be reissued for the same student in case it is not applied for by other student.
7. Librarian may recall the book at any time before the expiry of the due date.
8. Absence from college will not be considered as excuse for delay in return of books.
9. A fine amount of Rs.5/- per day shall be levied in case of late return of books including holidays.
10. All payments related to books are made to librarian.
11. Student is restricted from borrowing new books in case of any dues related to library.
12. Marking, underlining, tearing, folding pages or any damages caused to books are strictly forbidden.
13. Disciplinary action will be taken to the students who damage the book.
14. In case of loss or damage of books, 2 times of the cost of the book or similar book will be collected and also fine amount will be collected for non returning of the book.
15. The periodicals and reference books should be utilized only inside the library. No borrowing of periodicals and journals are allowed.
16. Students shall observe silence inside the library.
17. Library should not be used for any other purposes and misuses of library is strictly forbidden.

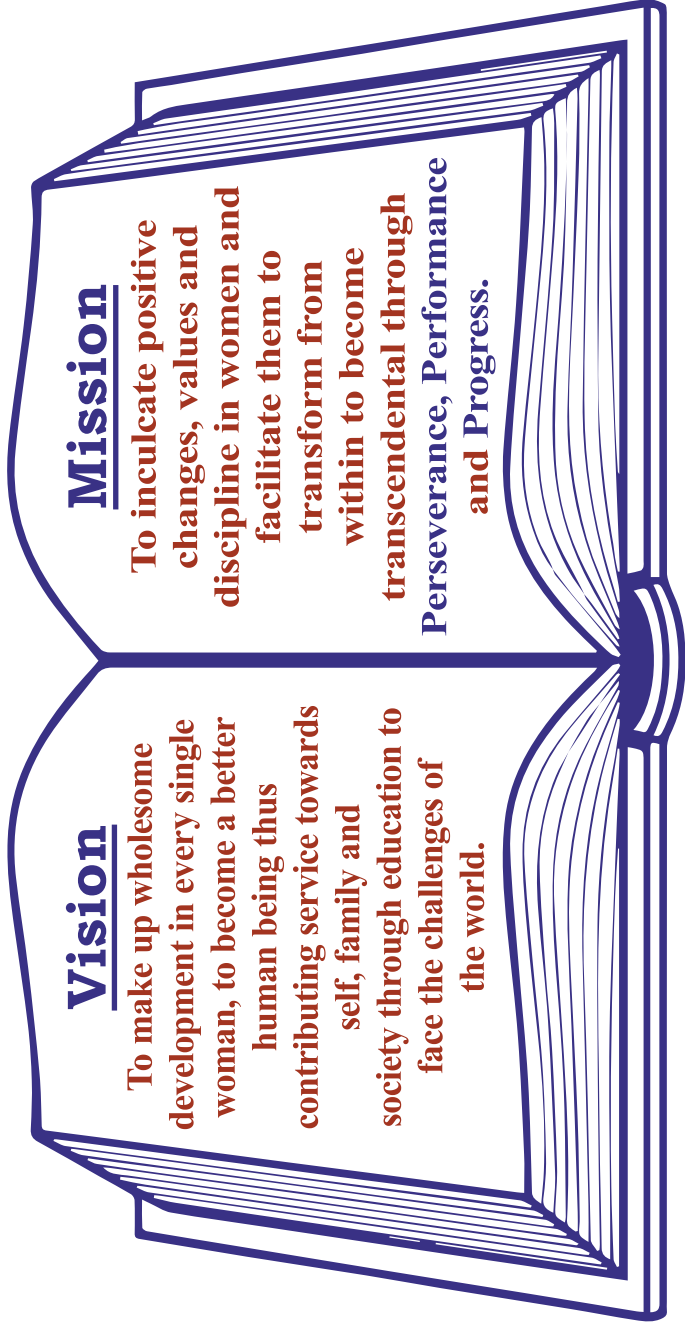
